RE: Re-Opening of the Oneida County Snowmobile Trail System

With some exceptions, the Oneida County Funded Snowmobile Trail System (as administered by the Oneida County Forestry, Land, & Recreation Department) will officially re-open at 12:00 noon on Friday, March 7, 2025 and will temporarily close at 8:00 a.m., Monday, March 10, 2025 due to the expected deterioration of the trails.

The following **trail closures** will remain in effect until further notice:

Hodag Sno-Trails:

- Corridor 12
- Corridor 13
- Corridor 15
- Trail 8
- Trail 47
- All Hodag Club Trails

Minocqua Forest Riders:

- Trail 5 (southern half) from TIN 522 to TIN 509 (Lincoln County Line)
- Trail 8 (western half) from TIN 522 to TIN 502 (Price County Line)

Northwoods Passage:

- Corridor 17
- Trail 8
- Club Trail 8B
- Club Trail 8C
- Club Trail 51B
- Club Trail 51C

Three Lakes:

Trail 45 from TIN 107 to TIN 101

All lake and river trails in Oneida County are considered unsafe and should not be utilized unless they have been clearly marked by a local snowmobile club.

As a reminder riders must stay on marked trails. Off trail riding is trespassing and could result in closure or loss of trails and citations and fines for those who participate.

Always exercise caution when riding a snowmobile. The trails are in rough late season condition.
